WLSSD Recyclable Materials

Effective October 1, 1998, each person or entity must separate from their waste, prior to collection by a Collector, the following Recyclable Materials:

**Aluminum, steel and tin beverage containers

Corrugated paper or Corrugated Container Board

**Glass food or beverage containers

**Magazines or catalogs (glossy paper)

**Newspaper or newsprint

Office paper

**Plastic containers labeled #1 or #2

**A minimum of what must be collected in household curbside collection of Recyclable Materials in cities with curbside collection

All other listed Recyclable Materials not included in the curbside program are accepted at local recycling drop-off centers.

In areas where curbside collection of Recyclable Materials is not provided, the Recyclable Materials may be taken to the local recycling shed or recycling drop-off centers.
